INTRODUCTION

On 31st July 2019, the Social Security Department of MoF and the EU-China Social Protection Reform Project- Component 2 held a closing event to recall the results and achievements obtained by the project during its five years implementation.

The meeting was chaired by Mr. Di Donghui (Deputy Director General, Department of Social Security, Ministry of Finance). The opening speeches were delivered by Mr. Fu Jinling, Director General of the Social Security Department of MoF, Ms. Sakura Moretto, EUD Project officer, and Ms. Valeria Bonavolontà of INPS, C2 Coordinator. Mr. Fu Jinling stressed the relevance of the project, its impact on MoF activities and the role it has played in strengthening the ties between EU countries and MoF.

In the first session, Mr. Bruni, C2 Resident Expert, recalled the activities performed by the component and the results achieved, while some of the Chinese experts involved in C2 activities provided their personal feedback and opinions on the project impact.

In the second session, Ms. Bonavolontà presented a summary of the overseas training activities and study visit carried out by the C2, which saw the participation of 53 MoF officials coming from 31 provinces and involved 107 EU experts and government officials. The discussion on the overseas activities was enriched by the intervention of Ms. Liu Liqun (Director, Department of Social Security, Finance Bureau of Jiangxi Province) who shared her personal impressions and gave a feedback on how the training had widened her knowledge of EU policy measures, impacted on her daily work, and enriched her professional network

The closing remarks were made by Ms. Bonavolontà and Mr. Fu.

More than 30 participants attended the event, in representation of MoF central and local governments, the EU Delegation to China, the Italian Institute of Social Protection, the Bank of Italy, the EU-China SPRP, the Renmin University, and the Chinese Academy of Social Science.

SESSION 1: WELCOME AND OPENING REMARKS

- ◆ **Mr. Di Donghui** (Deputy Director General, Department of Social Security, Ministry of Finance)

After extending his warm welcome to all the participants, Mr. Di, introduces: Mr. Fu, Director General of the Department of Social Security, Ministry of Finance; Ms. Bonavolontà, from INPS; Ms. Moretto, from the EU Delegation to China; Ms. Sales, from the Bank of Italy; Mr. Bruni, C2 Resident Expert; Ms. Breza, C3 Resident Expert; Prof. Fang Lianquan, C1 Chinese Research expert; Prof. Wang Xiaojun Dean, School of Statistics, Renmin University of China; Prof. Jiang Zhen, National Academy of Economic Strategy, Chinese Academy of Social Sciences; Prof. Guo Yu, Renmin University of China.

- ◆ **Mr. Fu Jinling** (Director General, Department of Social Security, Ministry of Finance)

Mr. Fu extends his warm welcome to all the experts and officials attending the event, especially Ms. Bonavolontà, Ms. Moretto, Mr. Bruni, as well as the experts and the representatives of the provincial offices of the Ministry of Finance. He recalls that some of the 53 provincial officials of the Ministry of Finance that took part to the training activities held in EU countries were attending the closing event.

The C2 project started operations in 2015, following the signing of the EU-China agreement for SPRP phase 2 in 2013, between MoFCOM and EU. MOF and INPS started immediately a close collaboration and partnership, working together in many activities and delivering high quality reports. The studies produced during the project address some very relevant topics such as: Social security coverage on atypical employment; Social contribution collections; Development of Old-age Services and Long Term Care System, etc.. Even more importantly, some research results have been translated into MoF policy documents. For instance, the conclusions of the study on the division of decision power and expenditure responsibilities on social security between central and local government were integrated on a government document produced by MoF. Also the policy recommendations of the research on the management of social security funds were translated into a government paper that suggested the introduction of risk control methodologies and investment strategies. The project research and overseas trainings in the field of Long-Term Care contributed to MoF better understanding of the issue of long term care, by providing an overview of EU practices.

As a whole, the project activities set the policy framework for MoF work in the reform of the social security system and the officials from both the central and local offices are very satisfied with the project achievements, while the outputs of C2 activities are being fully used.

Besides the overseas training courses, the project organized field visits by EU and Chinese experts' to Tianjin, Guanxi and Chongqing. These activities strengthened the collaboration and provided fruitful results. For example, during the 2016 training course held in Italy, the MoF had fruitful discussions with INSP, MEF, Bank of Italy, etc. Some of the lessons learned are reflected in the 13th five-year plan and have been transferred to the government documentation aimed to improve the reform and development of the Chinese social security system.

To conclude, Mr. Fu extends his thanks to all those that contributed to the success and implementation of the project, starting from INPS, EUD and all the experts and officials involved. During the project, some MoF and INPS officials, such as Antonello Crudo, got new positions and

changed role; yet their contribution to the success of the project will be remembered. Before leaving the floor to Ms. Bonavolontà, Mr. Fu stresses that today's gathering is not only a closing event but also a results' sharing event.

♦ **Ms. Valeria Bonavolontà** (INPS, C2 Coordinator)

Ms. Bonavolontà expresses her great pleasure to attend the C2 2019 closing event and highlights INPS' great satisfaction for cooperating with the Ministry of Finance for five years so far. Ms. Bonavolontà expresses special thanks to the Director General, Mr. Fu, and to all the officials of MoF for supporting the organization of the final event. Special thanks are also extended to the C2 Resident Expert, Mr. Michele Bruni and the C2 project Assistant, Ms. Valentina Pignotti for the fruitful work done throughout the duration of the project.

At the end of the project, Ms. Bonavolontà deems important to recall the activities carried out for five years by the C2 and to assess outputs and achievements. As Mr. Fu has recalled, the topics analyzed by the C2 tackled the sustainability and adequacy of the social protection system, putting special attention to pensions. Many of the issues that China is facing in the field of social protection are the same as those faced by EU countries. More specifically, three main issues are under discussion in Europe: 1) population ageing and the sustainability of the social protection system; 2) technological innovation and labor market implications; 3) how to ensure a decent pension to everyone, with particular attention to those who have not continuous careers such as women and young people.

INPS is a member of the association of social protection Institutions of EU Countries (ESIP), that works in the field of social protection and regularly convenes, meeting four times a year: the main issues discussed within this association are the ones mentioned before.

Pension systems based on contributions are affected by the changes in the labor market structure. In this era of technological innovation and globalization, the labor market is going through fundamental changes. The French government is re-writing the pension system and the President Macron has announced that by 2020 France will have a new pension system, which should respond to the new social and economic needs. In Italy, the great pension reform of 1995 is now under discussion in order to face new social challenges, such as atypical jobs. The Italian NDC pension system, strictly based on contributions, presents the risk for the most vulnerable groups - mainly the young generations - of receiving a very low pension. There is therefore a political debate on this subject, as the fight against poverty is one of the main objectives of the current Italian Government. The EU Commission has also stressed the need for all EU countries to have a minimum salary.

These examples show that the project played an important role both for EU Countries and China, by creating a platform for discussing common issues.

On behalf of INPS, Ms. Bonavolontà concludes wishing that the cooperation between the EU Ministries/Institutions represented in the SPRP Consortium and the Chinese Ministry of Finance may continue, even after the end of the Project, on bilateral basis. It is important that the dialogue on social protection may go on as well as the mutual learning process established by the project.

♦ **Ms. Sakura Moretto** (Project Officer, Delegation of the European Union to China)

As the Component 2 project comes to an end, also the EU-China Social Protection Reform Project will be officially closing in September 2019. The EUD has followed and monitored the project on a regular basis, taking part to many activities with a lot of interest, admiration and satisfaction.

Starting in 2006, three EU-China projects on Social Protection Reform have succeeded each other over a 13-years period. The EU-China SPRP is the last one and represents the conclusion of this cooperation mechanism between EU and China.

The EU-China cooperation and dialogue in the area of employment and social affairs will continue through new cooperation mechanisms. One is the EU-China Policy Dialogue between the Directorate General for Employment and the China's Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security. Indeed, the DG Employment will be very much interested in understanding the results achieved by the SPRP and learning from the activities that were carried out and use them as a starting point for new types of interventions.

In the context of the final evaluation, the EUD will seek to help the Commission to understand the achievements of the project. The ToR for this assignment was shared with the Resident Experts to gather their feedback in the content and framework of the final evaluation. The EU Delegation would like the evaluation to be as useful as possible, by having independent evaluators examining the achievements in detail. Ms. Moretto appreciates that the outputs of C2 were incorporated in the Chinese policy reform; it will be relevant to go into details and understand the impact of the project on the Chinese government agenda.

After this project, there will be no other cooperation instruments in the form of the EU-CHINA SPRP, but there will be other EU-China partnership instruments supporting China's regional investments in social security and employment sectors.

Ms. Moretto concludes by thanking MoF and the C2 team for organizing the event and looks forward to the positive assessment of the results and achievements of the Component as well as of the project as a whole.

SESSION 2: SPRP COMPONENT 2 ACHIEVEMENTS

C2 overall summary of activities and results-Speaker: **Mr. Michele Bruni** (EU-China SPRP, Team Leader-C2 Resident Expert)

Mr. Bruni presents a summary of the C2 activities, outputs and achievements from the logic of a project evaluator, trying to provide a first assessment of the C2 work.

It has become compulsory to evaluate projects. The goal is to see whether the money has been well spent in the sense that the project has fulfilled its objectives, or at least to learn from the errors. There are two main types of evaluation: the evaluation of output and the evaluation of impact. The evaluation of output consists in verifying whether the targets of the projects have been achieved by checking the list of activities performed and the outputs delivered. The evaluation of impact is a much more complicated, but also much more interesting task.

The goal of the evaluation of impact is to see whether the project has made a difference. The idea is quite simple. It consists in comparing two worlds: a fictitious world in which the project was not implemented and the real world in which the project has been implemented and see how the second world differs. from the

first. The difference is the impact and it is the impact that justify the investment. So, in our case the question is: How would China look like if the Component 2 had not been implemented? Is it better of? And what about the beneficiaries?

The C2 pursued three results through the analysis of 10 topics. For each topic, the C2 carried out a series of activities, such as assessment of the Chinese situation; identification of European best practices; panel discussions; workshops; policies proposals. Furthermore, for some topics the C2 carried out additional research. It did also implement overseas training activities, study visits, and pilot analysis.

The output of the project is represented by: 10 Assessment reports on the Chinese situation; 10 European best practice reports; 10 Panel Discussion reports; 10 Workshop reports; 10 sets of Policy proposals; 4 additional research studies; 3 overseas training programs; 1 study visit; 3 pilots. The C2 has published 7 volumes containing the assessment reports, the European practices report and policies proposals; a volume covering the conference on ageing; and 7 Newsletters.

In order to produce these outputs C2 has mobilized 12 high level Chinese experts and 118 EU experts and public officials from 8 EU countries.

If we want to evaluate the impact of C2 we should first identify on which people did the project have an impact: Mof Officials, members of the Consortium, EU officials involved in project activities and members of the project team. Then we should look at which kind of impact the project could produce, for example: increase the understanding of the issues that have been tackled; provide a larger vision of the themes through a comparison with EU practices; help to build national and international networks; propose possible solutions. Lastly, we should also take into account the timing of the impact, which can be of short term and long term (even after the project ends).

In conclusion Mr. Bruni believes that the output of C2 has fully matched and satisfied the objectives set by the project, while the full impact of the activities carried out by the Component will emerge only in the long run.

Chinese experts' experience in the project - Speakers: Prof. Wang Xiaojun (Renmin University); Prof. Jiang Zhen (CASS); Prof. Guo Yu (Renmin University)

- Prof. Jiang Zhen (CASS)

Prof. Jiang Zhen takes the opportunity to share his personal reflections on the project. He participated in the research as expert on the topic of social assistance coordination. During the conversations he had with EU and Chinese experts, he realized that the design of social assistance programs should be in line with social and economic development. For all the countries facing this transition period, a common goal is to find a way to develop both justice and equity at the same pace. In this historical phase, many countries are facing a common challenge: the transformation from an industrial society to a knowledge based society. In this contest, new technologies are developing at a very fast speed and we should try to understand how to make a better use of them in the coordination of the social assistance system.

Prof. Jiang stresses that the methodology adopted by the project was very useful to organize the work, starting from MoF needs and open issues and having the possibility to receive a feedback from MoF and EU experts during the research process. The goal of the study was to produce valuable ideas, so that the decision makers could be informed about policy options and have a wider scope for policy development.

Prof. Jiang feels that the project allowed him to learn from international experiences. Through the EU practices he could better understand the unique features of some EU countries social security systems, based on their history and political evolution, and grasp the rationale behind them.

- Prof. Wang Xiaojun (Renmin University)

Prof. Xiaojun was involved in the C2 project since the very beginning, participating in the study of the models aimed to analyze the sustainability of a social protection system.

Before participating in the project, she already had a good understanding of the practices used in the U.S. the U.K. and Canada because a lot of material from these countries is available in English. Thanks to the project, she had the opportunity to investigate also the EU methodologies on sustainability analysis, which she feels could be very relevant to China.

Prof. Xiaojun was also impressed by the methodological approach of the project. In other projects Chinese and EU experts work together in the same paper, while in this SPRP project the research was carried out separately. Chinese experts worked on the assessment of the Chinese situation, while the EU experts provided concrete EU experiences. Then, the panel discussion and workshop provided the occasion to exchange opinions and conclusion. It is a problem-oriented approach, which starts from the issues proposed by MoF and is concluded with the targeted policy solutions provided by both EU and Chinese experts.

The project did also allow for exchanges among different studies that were carried out at the same time. For example, Prof. Xiaojun participated to the discussion on informal employment, and she had the opportunity to express her opinion on the subject. These discussions allowed confronting different viewpoint, offering the possibility to use different methodologies to solve practical issues.

As mentioned by Ms. Bonavolontà, ageing is a common issue both for China and EU. Prof. Xiaojun feels that the discussion carried out through the project was very inspiring. She remembers a EU expert that gave her a strong impression by introducing the EU positive ageing index and she found very interesting to learn a different approach to population ageing. In China scholars and policy makers usually use the term “how to respond to population ageing”, while many EU countries take the ageing society as normal. China should learn more from the EU on this aspect, finding ways to change old values, to tackle discrimination against the elderly, to engage elderly in social activities, also by creating an elderly friendly environment and extending life in good health.

- Prof. Guo Yu (Renmin University)

As early as 2013, when the project was under preparation, Prof. Guo Yu was involved with Prof. Fang Lianquan (CASS) in writing MoF requests. She then took part in many activities with C3-MoCA and lately participated to pilot activities with C2-MoF.

During the 5 years of the project, the international relations have changed, the EU-China partnership has strengthened, the project has been implemented at the right time. As Prof. Xiaojun mentioned, before the project Chinese scholars were looking mainly to the US, but this project has provided an important platform for the Chinese government to learn from Europe.

Also Prof. Guo Yu stresses the common challenges of EU and China, such as population ageing, changes in economic and labour market structures, employment forms, poverty reduction. But at the same time, it is evident that China is developing its own model of society with unique characteristics.

The project provided EU and China with a dialogue platform, by creating a mechanism of exchange and learning. Prof. Guo personally participated in pilot projects with C2 and when visiting the Tianjin social security center, she recalls that Mr. Bruni was impressed and learned a lot from China’s advanced system on some technological aspects. During the activities at the local level, she also learned that the officials from provincial governments had benefited a lot from the overseas training courses, which gave them the

opportunity to look at the policy solutions from new perspectives and adapt what is happening in other countries to their local situation.

Finally, Prof. Guo agrees with the previous speakers that the successful part of the methodology of the project was that of combining theoretical studies and targeted policy suggestions. The second positive aspect is the process, which includes EU-China exchanges, giving the opportunity to reflect on several issues as well as playing a role in providing solutions to the process of reform.

- C2 overseas training activities -Speaker: Ms. Valeria Bonavolontà (INPS, C2 Coordinator)

Ms. Bonavolontà shares some slides to recall the overseas activities organized in the framework of C2.

All the activities carried out in Europe were successful thanks to the support of INPS and SNA. Experts involved in the overseas activities came from several EU countries. The overseas activities were important to analyze some topics of common interest also for the EU.

More specifically, the following overseas activities were implemented:

- 1) In 2016: “European Practices for a Fair and Sustainable Social Security System. Governance, Long term Strategies and Financial Management”; the training, held in Rome and Florence, was directed to 15 officials from MoF and the participation of 37 EU experts and Public Officials from 3 EU Countries
- 2) In 2017: “Social Security in an Ageing Society: EU Practices Responding to the Demographic Challenge”; the training was held in Paris and Marseille, with 14 participants from MoF and mobilizing 25 EU Experts from 4 EU countries.
- 3) In 2018: “Financing the social security system in an ageing society: the role of public finance and private supplementary funds”; the training was held in Rome and Milan, the participants from MoF were 18 and the experts from 3 EU countries were 32.

To provide a wider access to EU experiences, the training combined lectures and visits to public institutions, NGOs, and private sector facilities. Most of the experts involved were representatives of public institutions, allowing MoF officials the possibility to discuss with European counterparts to share concrete firsthand experiences.

Finally, in 2019 the C2 carried out a study visit on the topic “Social Protection Policies in an Ageing Society– Funding Issues”. It was the first activity of this kind, characterized by a shorter length but with a focus on the country specific experiences. It took place in Romania and Belgium, and involved 6 participants from MoF.

-Experience from MoF participants -Speaker: Ms. Liu Liqun (Director, Department of Social Security, Finance Bureau of Jiangxi Province)

Ms. Liu said she was very glad for having the opportunity to share her experience in the overseas project activities. She took part to the 2016 training course and 2019 study visit.

According to Ms. Liu, the agenda of the courses were well structured, covering different topics and leaving space for discussions with university professors, officials, government stakeholders, service providers, etc. Through these trainings it was possible to gather information about different EU countries as well as understand the common structure of the social security system in the EU: it has a well-established framework, the social protection system is reliable, the coverage of social security is wide, means testing is used in many countries. Besides acquiring a general knowledge on social protection systems, the participants could also

have face to face discussions on practical activities, and understand the common challenges in social protection areas, faced by both EU and China.

The training provided not only an opportunity to learn from other countries, but also from other provinces, and after coming back to China it was possible to apply the experience learned in the daily work.

For example, Ms. Liu recalls that when she went back to Jianxi, she tried to apply the experiences gathered from Italy, Romania and Belgium. In particular, she suggested to develop an IT system for the social security fund, and suggested to the Finance Bureau of the Jiangxi Province to improve the use of the social security card that in EU is not only a way to distribute pension, but allows to obtain many other services. This brought to select 2 pilots to use the social security card to access medical assistance, housing, social assistance, etc. Finally, during the overseas courses, Ms. Liu learned a lot from some EU countries' performance evaluation of the assistance fund. Some EU countries use means testing also to supervise the use of social assistance resources and in the local finance departments should strengthen the check system along these lines.

The activities also had an impact at the individual level. Ms. Liu said they changed her perception and improved her understanding of the rationale and philosophy behind the social security reforms that had taken place in EU countries. These experiences were extremely valuable and can help the development of China's social security system.

SESSION 3: CLOSING REMARKS

◆ Ms. Valeria Bonavolontà (INPS, C2 Coordinator)

Summing up and closing the meeting, Ms. Bonavolontà shares some keywords expressed by the speakers that represent the idea of what was done during the project:

Collaboration, definition of responsibility, interactions

Understanding, inspiring, valuable ideas for decision makers

Results, implementation, achievement, impact

Mutual learning process and exchange on practical issues

◆ Mr. Fu Jinling (Director General, Department of Social Security, Ministry of Finance)

The EU-China SPRP has been a very fruitful, highly efficient project that will have a far-reaching impact.

Today, the colleagues from EU and China have shared the achievements obtained during the implementation of the project. It is impossible to mention all the recent government actions that have been influenced by the C2 SPRP. It can however be recalled that the government decided to adapt the NDC in the social security system, while the collection system of social security contributions has been unified under the tax authority,

Regarding the project methodology, it was a problem-oriented approach: first MoF identified the challenges and then EU and Chinese experts proposed solutions useful for China; thanks to this process outputs and deliverables of the C2 were very fruitful.

The project has been implemented with high efficiency thanks to the involvement of various EU and Chinese stakeholders; special thanks are also addressed to the Resident Expert, Mr. Bruni, and the Project Assistant, Ms. Pignotti, because they were responsible for the communication and project management, and have worked with great dedication.

Looking at the project impact, Mr. Fu underlines that we need to take into account the direct impact, the indirect impact and the potential impact. There is a short term and long-term impact on China's reform and social security system, as well as both direct and indirect impact. Firstly, this project produced many visible outputs; secondly it has strengthened friendship between Chinese and European countries, and in the case of MoF it has especially strengthened the partnership between the Italian and the Chinese Ministry of Finance. When Mr. Fu attended the first China Italy Finance Dialogue, (a working mechanism initiated by the two governments), he noticed that both the Italian and Chinese side listed in the topics of the dialogue population ageing and social security, It is evident that the project shaded light on the importance of these fields and that we should continue the cooperation.

The studies and activities of the project have supported the actions of the Chinese government. If relevant to the project, MoF could spell out the support and impact of the project in the specific action and policies before the September closing event. Besides the short-run impact we should also consider the potential impact, because it takes time for MoF to compare different models, digest the information and translate ideas into specific policies/actions.

The project cooperation laid solid foundation between EU and China, in the case of MoF mostly between Italy and China, creating a new phase for cooperation. Despite of the different culture and history, EU and China share many common issues that can be discussed together.

Ms. Bonavolontà talked about the challenge of population ageing. This is an issue that China and Europe are both facing, as well as technological innovation and its impact on employment, that also affect the pension system and the contribution rate.

The Chinese government is discussing new measures to tackle the ageing issue and the sustainability of the social protection system, such as new taxation mechanisms based on expenditure; a gradual increase of the retirement age; the use of state asset investment to finance pension fund, etc.

Regarding equity, the issue is how to ensure to low income people to benefit equally from the social protection system; China finance partially or totally the disabled people pension system, through social assistance programs to ensure that they have decent life; yet more measures are under discussion.

Ms. Moretto talked about employment promotion policies. In China MoHRSS is responsible to promote employment, yet the funds are allocated by the Ministry of Finance, and unemployment insurance fund allocated 100 billion RMB as part of its efforts to support a vocational training scheme and stabilize employment. According to Mr. Fu this area is very relevant, and EU and China should continue future collaboration in this field.

The project paved the way for future cooperation; in the future the bilateral cooperation and collaboration will be strengthened and will continue after the project conclusion.

Through the platform of the SPRP many contacts and friendship relations have been established. Just recently China's Ministry of Finance and the Italian MEF set up a communication mechanism, identifying social security and ageing society as priority areas for future dialogue; so we will both work hard to design the next step of collaboration. The next Italy-China finance dialogue will be held in China.

To conclude, Mr. Fu particularly thanks again the C2 project Coordinator, Ms. Valeria, the project officer, Ms. Moretto, the Resident Expert, Mr. Bruni, the Project Assistant, Ms. Pignotti, as well as all the MoF colleagues from local and central finance bureaus for the continuous and joint effort in the realization of the Project.
